



IOSH Managing Safely Training

Clwyd Associates was the first company to develop blended learning for the IOSH Managing Safely course - this means we can provide the training in a variety of formats – in fact whichever way suits our clients. Since the standard IOSH material was not designed for blended learning, Clwyd Associates uses material (licensed by IOSH) that they developed to meet the syllabus – this includes scenarios and exercises focused on the relevant industry.

Face to face training – this is the standard format for the course – it allows the training to be completed over four consecutive days, or in a two day per week, or in one day per week format.

The participants are taken through all the course material by the tutor, but they also receive the distance learning notes during the course, which provides invaluable reference material for the future.

The knowledge of participants is assessed at the end of the course using a summative test (which is completed on the fourth day of the course) and a risk assessment project (which must be returned to Clwyd Associates within two weeks of the course completion date).

Blended learning - this involves two days face to face training with the other two days studying time completed by the participants using the paper-based distance learning notes. Many organisations prefer this format where they have difficulty releasing staff for four days.

Our training programme focuses on the practical skills during the two day face-to-face period - participants get the chance to work in groups to apply some of the common health and safety tools and techniques.

Following the blended learning, the summative test is invigilated by a member of staff of the client organisation once the distance learning is complete. The invigilator then returns the test papers to Clwyd Associates (along with the project paperwork) enclosing a statement confirming that the test was run under exam conditions. This also increases the flexibility of the course if all learners are unable to get together at one time for the test.

Distance learning – this format is suitable for those who cannot afford any time in the classroom. They can complete the course independently using the distance learning notes, but with telephone/e-mail tutor support.

The summative test and project are managed in the same way that they are for blended learning.
